Kennedy chose lawyers to fill six of the ten cabinet posts. They are Robert F. Kennedy, Attorney General; J. Edward Day, Postmaster General, and Secretaries Stewart L. Udall, Interior; Orville L. Freeman, Agriculture; Arthur J. Goldberg, Labor, and Abraham A. Ribicoff, Health, Education and Welfare. In the 87th Congress 62 of the 100 Senators and 241 of the 437 Representatives are lawyers.
