FOUNDER'S DAY

The fourteenth annual celebration in honor of William W. Cook, founder of the Lawyers Club of the University of Michigan and donor of the buildings on the Law Quadrangle, will be held on Friday, April 21, 1939. The honorable Charles P. Megan of the Chicago Bar, trustee of the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad by appointment of the Federal Court and formerly President of the Illinois State and Chicago Bar Associations and Chairman of the National Conference of Bar Examiners, will be the guest of honor. The events of the day will culminate in a dinner at the Lawyers Club at 6:30 o'clock at which Mr. Megan will speak.

At 2 o'clock in the afternoon the annual Second-Year-Student Inter-Case-Club contest will be held. At the conclusion of the competition the Henry M. Campbell award will be conferred upon the winners. A group of four second year students consisting of John J.

Adams, John L. Rubsam, Robert A. Solomon and Roy L. Steinheimer, Jr., who have shown the greatest proficiency in the regular case club work during the current year will argue a moot case before a distinguished bench of judges who have been invited for the occasion.
