Garden City, N. Y.: Doubleday, Doran & Co., Inc. 1937. Pp. xv, 344. \$3. ~ A narrative and discussion of the period preceding and immediately following the framing of the Constitution, used by the author as a means for expounding his views on current governmental and constitutional issues; strongly suggests some curbing of the "judicial veto."

UNIFORM STATE ACTION; A Possible Substitute for Centralization. By *W. Brooke Graves*—Professor of Political Science, Temple University. Chapel Hill, N. C.: University of North Carolina Press. 1934. Pp. xii, 368. \$3.50. ~ Surveys the scope, and analyzes the significance and possibilities, of interstate relations, legislature, administrative and judicial.
