MICHIGAN'S MOOT COURT TEAM WON A BERTH IN THE NATIONAL QUARTER-FINALS to be held in New York next month. Bill Tell and Blair Benjamin went through four rounds undefeated to top the regional tournament held in Detroit last Friday and Saturday. They downed U. of D., Ohio State, Wayne State and Detroit College of Law in that order. Although handicapped by having to switch sides on just a few hours notice, they defeated in the final round the same D.C.L. team which had eliminated Michigan's John Matta and Jim Burton in the second round.....Bill Tell received the Tiffany Bowl from the American College of Trial Lawyers for the best oral argument in the final round.

"WIGGE AND ROBBE", TRADITIONAL FALL FORMAL, WILL NOT BE HELD THIS YEAR. The Barristers called off their annual pre-Christmas dance because the facilities they had planned on will not be available to them.

THE S.B.A. BOARD UNANIMOUSLY AGREED TO DISCONTINUE PUBLICATION OF THE QUAD, the Law School annual. Factors which impelled the decision were the heavy financial burden inherited from last year and the lack of anyone interested in assuming responsibility for editing it.

PROFESSOR JOINER ANNOUNCED THE TOPIC OF THE ANNUAL SUMMER INSTITUTE TO BE HELD HERE EARLY NEXT JUNE. "Law School and Legal Education-Tomorrow" will be the subject of the discussions by the lawyers, professors and administrators in attendance.....Specifically the group hopes to cover such points as the quality of the student body, improved standards of admission, delineation between pre-legal and post-admission education and the means of assuring that the legal profession will continue to attract its share of competent people to serve society. Research responsibility of school and faculty, and the manner in which such research can be financed will also be considered. The purpose of the Institute said Professor Joiner is not to set up minimum standards of faculty, library size and classroom facilities but to stress the goals which the law schools of this country must aim toward.....On the 7th and 8th of this month representatives from law schools, business and the government met with representatives from the Michigan faculty to lay the groundwork of the Institute.
