EXTENDED 2 DAYS

Law school classes will not be held on Friday and Saturday, January 3 and 4, as originally scheduled in the catalogue, according to Assistant Dean Roy Proffitt. Classes will resume on Monday, January 6, 1958.

The change allows two full weeks of Christmas vacation, beginning at noon on Saturday, December 21.

First semester classes will now run through Saturday morning, January 18. The examination period begins that afternoon and continues according to the schedule published at the beginning of the semester.

The remainder of the calendar is unchanged.
