SECOND SERIES OF COOLEY LECTURES

The second series of the Thomas M. Cooley Lectures will be delivered in Room 120, Hutchins Hall at 4:15 P. M. on February 23-27, inclusive. Professor Burke Shartel of the University of Michigan Law School will be the lecturer. His general subject will be "Our Legal System and How It Operates." The subjects of the five lectures are as follows:

These lectures should be of interest not only to law students but also to lawyers and to other persons interested in legal philosophy. Professor Shartel has taught Jurisprudence in the University of Michigan Law School since 1930 and during that time has developed a distinct philosophy of the legal system. It may be appropriately designated by the term "legal dynamics." The lectures will present a working philosophy of law in action.

Professor Shartel holds the A.B. and J.D. degrees from the University of Michigan and the S.J.D. from Harvard University. After practicing law for some time in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, he began the teaching of law at the University of Illinois in 1919. In 1920 he became a member of the faculty of the University of Michigan Law School.

The Thomas M. Cooley Lectureship was established last year in honor of Thomas M. Cooley, who was a member of the first faculty of the University of Michigan Law School. The lectureship is made possible through the William W. Cook Endowment for Legal Research. The first Thomas M. Cooley lecturer was Professor Henry Rottschaefer of the University of Minnesota. His lectures on "The Constitution and Socio-Economic Change" were delivered in Hutchins Hall on March 24-28, 1947, inclusive.
