## Edwin Charles Goddard

The death of Professor-Emeritus Edwin C. Goddard on August 14, 1942, is a distinct loss to the Law School, the University and the community. Professor Goddard was born August 20, 1865, in Winnebago, Illinois. He had been a member of the Law School faculty for thirty-five years, from 1900 until his retirement in 1935. His passing is mourned by all who knew him. Professor Goddard was distinguished not only in his profession but for his great interest in and helpfulness to young people and for his active part in community affairs.
